
Pratt Museum to Host Book Release Event, *Portraying the Wide, Open Spaces*, with author Michael Engelhard

About Michael Engelhard A cultural anthropologist and longtime outdoor instructor, Engelhard specialized in land use, subsistence, and symbolic aspects of landscapes. He is the recipient of several literary awards, including a Rasmuson Individual Artist Award and three Alaska Press Club Awards. His writing has been featured in *Outside* magazine, *Alaska* magazine, and *Earth Island Journal*.
